# 2. Introduction and principles

The Borough of Havant Sports and Leisure Trust (also known as Horizon Leisure Centres, 'the Organisation') has identified the legal, moral, and ethical requirements to create, develop and implement an Environmental Strategy (ES).

In the pursuance of this, the organisation has adopted the following principles to enable better, more informed decisions.

### 2.1 The 3 Ps (<u>Appendix 5.1</u>)

The 3Ps of sustainability are a well-known and accepted business concept. The Ps refer to People, Planet, and Profit, also often referred to as the triple bottom line. Sustainability has the role of protecting and maximising the benefit of the 3Ps. Green programs take care of people. They acknowledge the planet's needs by respecting its valuable resources, and they aim to produce profit without waste.



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As Horizon Leisure Centres is a Company Limited by Guarantee and a Registered Charity, instead of profit, it generates a surplus, which is reinvested in support of the Organisation's Charitable Objects.

### 2.2 Environmental Impact Boston Matrix [EIBM] (Appendix 5.2)

The Organisation will identify and make ES-related decisions using the Environmental Impact Boston Matrix (EIBM). The level of impact is calculated by multiplying two values (scored 1-6):

- Current impact on Horizon Leisure Centres
- Level of interest to stakeholders

This in turn will drive the priority of the ES and help the Organisation in continual improvement and to achieve the objectives of this document.

# 3. Objective

It is the objective of the Organisation to reduce the environmental impact of operating facilities and provide more opportunities for customers and employees to make environmentally sustainable decisions.

The Organisation recognises that our Vision will only be achieved through a combination of refining existing practices and introducing new technologies whilst planning new developments to include environmental management at design stage. Instructing, informing, training, and supervising our colleagues in the importance of our environmental Vision to ensure a positive culture will be integral to its success.

#### 3.1 Vision

- 3.1.1 To demonstrably reduce and offset our carbon footprint and produce annual reports that will be submitted to the Organsiation's Trustee Board and key stakeholders (such as Havant Borough Council).
- 3.1.2 Horizon confirms its commitment to support Havant Borough Council's target of carbon net zero by 2050, as stated in its *Corporate Strategy* 2022-26.
- 3.1.3 Obtain ISO14001- Environmental Management compliance by 2025.
- 3.1.4 Reach carbon net zero for all our facilities by 2050.



#### 3.2 Mission

- 3.2.1 To put sustainability and the environmental strategy at the forefront of key organisational decisions, including but not exclusive to:
  - Facility operations
  - Acquisition of new assets
  - Design of facilities
  - Transport
  - Refuse management


